A few ways in which I can help you:

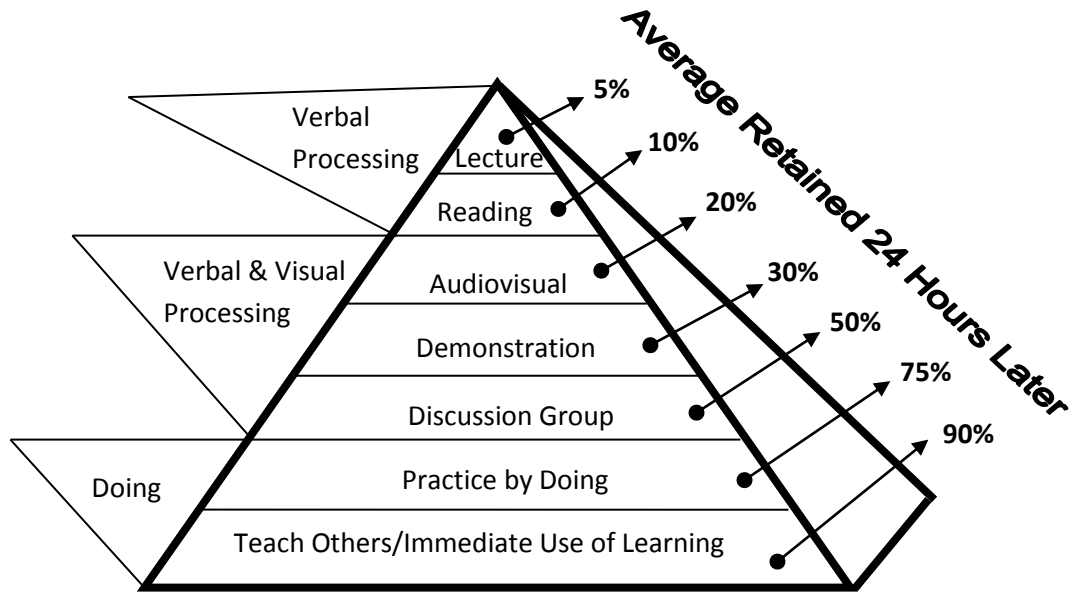
- Brainstorm with you for an upcoming lesson
