


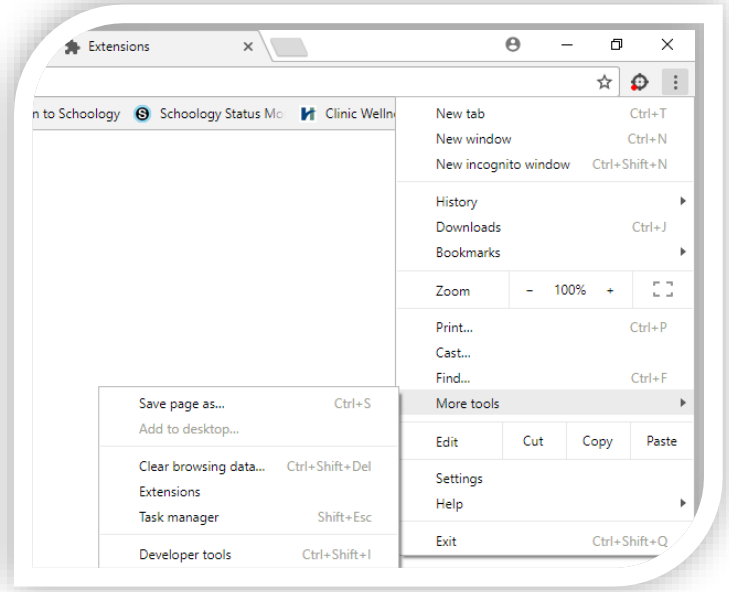


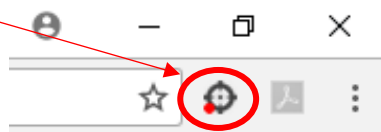
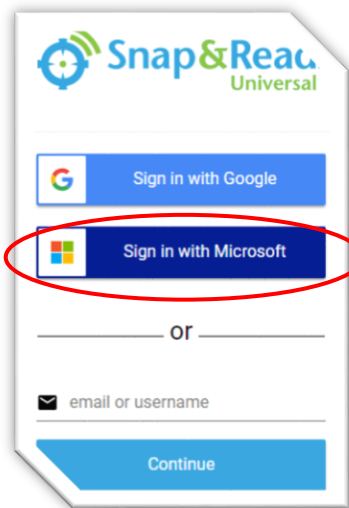
Snap&Read Chrome Extension Install

In order to allow Snap&Read Extension to read PDF and HTML files saved on your computer, a Chrome extension must be installed.

1. Launch the Google Chrome browser.
2. Click the Customize Google Chrome button  (top right toolbar).
3. Select “More Tools”, then select “Extensions”.
4. Scroll to the bottom and click on  [Get more extensions](#)
5. In the search bar type “Snap&Read” and click “add to Chrome”. Check the boxes next to “Allow incognito” and “access to file URLs”.

6. Once installed, click on the snap&read icon on top right toolbar and it will require you to sign in. Use your network credentials to “Sign in with Microsoft”.



You can now drag PDF and HTML files saved on your computer to the Chrome browser and have them read aloud using the Snap&Read Universal Chrome Extension.
